

## **ACCOMPLISHMENTS SO FAR**

- Request for Application (RFA) Developed and issued the RFA in Fall
   2015 to all Healthy Start Coalitions
- Proposals Reviewed and accepted proposals from 8 Healthy Start
   Coalitions on behalf of their communities
- Contracts Executed contracts (January 1, 2016 September 30, 2017) for 8 projects
- **Funding** Provided funding (\$90,000 to \$170,000 based on number of births) to support CI&R ALC activities in local communities
- Facilitation Consultant Engaged City MatCH to facilitate our ALC meetings





## **LOCAL TEAMS – WHAT AND WHO**

Participating Healthy Start Coalitions are forming local teams:

Northeast Florida Healthy Start Coalition
Healthy Start Coalition of Orange County
Healthy Start of Manatee

- CI&R projects will include 13 counties Alachua, Bay, Duval, Flagler, Hillsborough, Jefferson, Madison, Manatee, Orange, Osceola, Seminole, Taylor, and Volusia
- Last year these counties had more than 70,000 pregnant women with 57,000 completing the universal prenatal screen.





- Each Local Team will have at least two Co-Leads.
- Local Teams include Healthy Start Coalition, Department of Health, Healthy Families, MIECHV-funded project, Federal Healthy Start Program, Early Head Start, Early Steps, other home visitation programs, consumer(s), and other key stakeholders.
- Each Local Team is strongly encouraged to include consumers/participants as team members, including on the travel team.
- Many Coalitions will be adding staff to help with the work of the Local Teams.





## **Local Team Activities**

- Plan for CI&R activities build relationships, understand available services, map current processes, identify opportunities for change, and more.
- Determine the model/approach that your team wants to test.
- Develop business services agreements that outline responsibilities and linkages to each other allowing for sharing of client information.





- Develop and test a decision tree for referral process.
- Develop and test centralized screening log to track clients.
- Obtain and use consumer input as CI&R is being planned as well as when the local model is tested.





## **Group Activities**

- Cross-Site Activities Travel team (3 5 people) will attend three in-person meetings to discuss, share and learn about CI&R work in eight participating communities.
- Technical Assistance Calls and Webinars Calls will be monthly for planning, sharing, and dialogue about challenges and successes.
   Webinars will focus on key topics of interest to the teams and will be held regularly.
- Third-party evaluation Participate in evaluation by University of South Florida.










# Consolidated Framework for Implementation Research (CFIR)

# **Evaluation Questions**



#### What are MIECHV CI&R team members' ...

- individual characteristics (agencies and service sectors, organizational roles, knowledge, beliefs, self-efficacy, etc.) that support implementation of CI&R models?
- perceptions of the CI&R model that will predict adoption within their programs?



#### How do the MIECHV CI&R teams ...

- identify and describe characteristics of the inner setting (organization/program) and the outer setting (community partners/state programs) in their communities that serve as barriers or facilitators to adoption of the CI&R models?
- describe perceptions, concerns and interactions within their collaborative that reflect group dynamics?
- create a timeline for implementation (planning, engaging, executing, reflecting, evaluating)?
- describe the successes and challenges encountered in the early stages of the CI&R model development process?

... Did these individual characteristics and group dynamics show positive change over time?
